Chairman's Chatter

First and foremost, I'd like to thank the outgoing Chairman, Mike Henty for another year at the helm of Mawdesley Parish Council. Mike has done a wonderful job in leading the Council from the front by being engaged in a number of projects; from the routine and reoccurring e.g. dog fouling and speeding to the uplifting and progressive e.g. Moss Fields projects and community initiatives. If it's supporting the community Mike has been there. Mike has also helped the Parish Council continue to operate through the pandemic by chairing our parish council meeting via Zoom which had an unexpected benefit of attracting many more members of the public to our monthly meetings. Thanks Mike and I know I can count on you for advice and support in the year to come.

Hopefully we're seeing the return to normality and with a bit of luck we can continue to grow the community spirit that is the legacy of the pandemic. As clubs and societies start to open their doors again the village is filled with a sense of renewed positivity. This was evidenced in July when the Millennium Green Committee hosted a fantastically well organised and executed open day. I must admit I was surprised to see such a big turnout of stalls, concessions and families all joining in to make the event a success.

The Village Hall also opened up with some razzamatazz. They celebrated the completion of their refurbishment work with an open day - fun and games for all.

Other annual events re-emerging such as the Scarecrow Festival, The Mawdesley Open Gardens and the Village clean up day are great examples of how the community come together to help each other and have fun too. I know that many of the community groups and charities have suffered from lost revenues, so I hope that we can all benefit from a resurgence in community engagement.

We continue to help support the maintenance and improvement of the footpaths and bridleways around the village. Many of these are across private land and we are working with the landowners to ensure they are as accessible as they can be for the village and the many visitors we now get to Mawdesley. The footpath along side Jigsaw and the footpath from Bradshaw Lane to Tarnbeck (aka The Alpaca Path) have received some investment in time and materials this year. Thanks to Peter Boardman and Steve Ashton for helping us keep these paths open. If there are any volunteers willing to lend a hand either physically or financially, the Parish Council can help co-ordinate that support and make further improvements for all to enjoy.

The footpaths in Moss Fields are a great addition to the village amenity. As the fields settle into their new role as a nature haven and restful place, we're encouraging wildlife with bird boxes, bug hotels, sympathetic grass and tree management. As councillors and volunteers, we are not experts and we always seek professional advice before undertaking any land management tasks. We are happy to hear the views of the public and would thank anyone for constructive comments. This is a village asset and we want to make it as relevant as we can for everyone.

The Parish Council have successfully applied for 120 saplings for the Moss Fields and other corners of public space. We were recently notified by The Woodland Trust that our application had been accepted and the saplings will be delivered to us in November. We'll be looking for volunteers young and old to help us plant these for future generations to enjoy. Please get in touch if you are able to help with the planting.

Traffic and speed are once again on the agenda. Although the Parish Council is not responsible for the roads and safety management, we are often engaged in helping the village channel their observations, suggestions and complaints to the relevant authorities which are; Lancashire Constabulary and Lancashire County Council. Our fellow Councillor, Lisa Rutter has volunteered to be our speed awareness liaison champion and has done a sterling job in engaging with Lancashire Constabulary and highlighting the problems Mawdesley faces.

I can't close this article without giving a huge public thanks to Angela (Parish Clerk) and John Nicholls (Assistant Parish Lengthsman) who have announced their retirement this year. They have recently moved to their retirement home in Garstang. We of course wish them a long and happy retirement and expect to see them visiting us in the village for many years to come.

We now welcome Trish Grimshaw as the new Parish Clerk (contact details on the back page of this newsletter). Trish is an experienced clerk and is keen to get to know the village and support us in our future endeavours.
