# **Spotted in Mawdesley** at the end of January

Thanks to a resident who took this photograph at the end of January when he looked up from his living room to see two deer in his garden. He says that they are Roe Deer as confirmed by the British Deer Society who go on to say the one on the right is a female (doe), being followed by a male (buck) which is in the early stages of re-growing his antlers (they drop, or 'cast', these, every year around November or December and have grown new ones by the spring). Roe deer are usually solitary or may be seen in small family parties. and they do not form herds as the larger species will do. They are widely distributed across the UK and guite common though they tend to be secretive.

The day began when we clambered up to our seats ready to begin the final rehearsals with Greg the amazing conductor. During this time, we perfected our fun dance moves which accompanied the singing. Next, great fun was had whilst we stayed in our seats, eating our packed lunches, sharing bags of sweets and watching as the audience drifted in little by little until, eventually, the whole arena was filled.

At last the concert began! The lights dimmed, the audience fell silent, then, in the darkness, the melodic beat of the orchestra could be heard. The next moment, colourful lights dazzled down on them. There followed a huge variety of acts, including Irish dancers, bag-pipes, powerful drummers and super soloists. Interspersed with all this were our vibrant songs.

One particular high point for us all was when we sang a beautiful, gentle song called *'I Sing Out'*. The whole place was darkened, then the entire audience raised their mobile phone torches. The effect was overwhelming.

# **Red Admiral Music Academy**



We've had a busy and exciting start to 2019.

Our newly formed Red Admiral Brass Band took part in their first official contest as a 4th Section Registered Band. This was Brass at the Guild at Preston Guild Hall. Red Admiral Brass secured a fantastic 3rd place which was a brilliant result considering it was the first contest for most of our players.



Red Admiral Youth Band (pictured) took part in the British Open Youth Brass Band Championships and were up against some of the best Youth Bands in the country, including the current and previous European Champions. We were taking part with no expectations of coming anywhere but once again surprised everyone, including ourselves, with a staggering 4th place as well as winning the prize for the best soloist (13 year old Lewis Barton) and the prize for the youngest player (7 year old Thomas Robinson).

Our Youth Band also took part in the Halifax Minster Brass Festival along with 5 other bands from the North of England. This was an opportunity to showcase our Youth Band in a non-competitive environment and the event finished with around 170 young musicians performing a massed band finale.

We hosted a Preview Concert ahead of the North West Regional Brass Band Championships. Red Admiral Youth opened the evening and then 5 Brass Bands from across the North West performed to a packed Chorley Town Hall, with Red Admiral Brass performing as the 4th section band.

Red Admiral Brass took to the stage at Blackpool Winter Gardens, competing for the first time in the North West Regional Brass Band Championships. One of the biggest events in the brass band calendar, with 75 bands taking part, it was a fantastic experience for us.

As an organisation we are continuing to grow. We have new players joining us on a weekly basis and we have just taken on our 9th School Partnership where we will be teaching another 60 children how to play brass instruments. This is fantastic news but providing an enormous challenge of being able to raise the funds to keep up with the demand for additional instruments. #### Dear Resident

#### **CURRENT ROAD SITUATION**

We have significant concerns about the stretch of the B5246 between its junction with the A5209 on Parbold Hill, where HGV's are advised to continue on the A road, and the A59 at Rufford which is already sign posted as 'UNSUITABLE FOR HGVS'.

#### **OUR RESPONSE**

We are campaigning for an enforcable weight restriction to legally limit the use of this road by the larger HGV's as the road has proved inadequate for vehicles of this size.
